A Look Back at 2021

2021 Change of Command

Every two years the Blackwater Pyrates perform a “Change of Command” in order to allow another unworthy Pyrate to lead this motely crew into the future.

On January 16, 2021 the tradition continued as Captain Murky and his Quartermaster Two Sox and Coxswain Maltease presented the Command flag to Captain Lucky and his Quartermaster Woody and Coxswain Way Big Tom in a ceremony conducted on the Milton boardwalk.

As the Captain is an elected position, an election is held every two years at the General Membership meeting in November. Prior to the election, any Pyrate in good standing (i.e. still able to stand) may be nominated for the position. The newly elected Captain then designates who will stand beside him as Officers for the next two years.

The Code

In late 2019 a committee was formed in an attempt to update the Code. For our newer members, the Code is basically the foundation of the Blackwater Pyrates organization. When our founding fathers (and mothers) met in secrecy many years ago at the infamous “Beer Barn”, they determined that something must be written to identify a basic set of guidelines that the Pyrates would follow.

Several days (and many adult beverages) later this same group of Pyrates attempted to review the scroll that they had prepared. Unable to decipher what appeared to be the Dead Sea Scrolls, they agreed to a few basic guidelines. And so The Code was born.

The Code

After many years and countless addenda, it was determined that an updated version of the Code was well overdue. That is when the Rewrite Committee was created and jumped into action.

Countless evenings were dedicated to discussions as to the format and substance that would encompass the new Code. When the pandemic of 2020 began, our fearless committee were slowed but not deterred. With quills in hand they continued penning the changes that would soon become a part of Blackwater Pyrate lore.

Finally, at the March 17, 2021 General Membership Meeting, the “new” Code was presented to the Captains and Crew. It had been reviewed by everyone, several minor corrections were made, and then finally the finished product was successfully voted into existence. Soon, copies will be made readily available to all members.

In March of 2021, many events remain in limbo. The Arts Festival was among those held hostage to the pandemic. However, another Pirate (Pirate with an “I” not “Y”) organization requested that we join them at the Santa Rosa County fair grounds for the Renaissance Fair.

Since the Arts Festival was our major time for fundraising, this was our opportunity to make up for lost time on duck sales adoptions. Additionally, the organizations sponsoring the event wanted the Blackwater Pyrates so bad that they waived all fees for setting up our ship and merchandise tents. They also allowed us to park our trailer on site as well as provided resources for parking our “safety” RV and associated vehicles immediately behind our ship.

Their generosity did not go unnoticed as many Blackwater Pyrates attended the event. Together, several Pirate organizations united to support the local community and the Santa Rosa Chamber of Commerce. We were also able to exceed our expectations on duck sales adoptions and created a lasting bond with the other pirate groups.

As we look to the future, the Milton Arts Festival remains our primary fund raising event. However, if possible and enough Pyrates agree to assist, we may join the Renaissance Fair again. It is extremely time consuming to prepare for and operate a single event of this magnitude, and nearly impossible to support two events simultaneously. We will be looking for volunteers to operate our primary event first and then possibly enough to fill in at the secondary location.

Currently, the tentative schedule for the events is March 5 & 6, 2022. Updates and volunteer lists will come out as we receive additional information.

Since the Arts Festival is our primary source of revenue (fund raising), participation in this event is strongly encouraged. The Blackwater Pyrate Event Chairperson for the Arts Festival is Vixen, and with her leadership and “meticulous” record keeping abilities, I assure you that this year will be another successful event.

Please talk with her about volunteering to help. It is always a very fun and entertaining event. We can always count on the Pyrates for support.

Our Missions

The Blackwater Pyrates have three core missions. Boater Safety, River Clean-Up and Maritime History Preservation. Annually, we schedule events around those missions.

Generally, in April we have a “lower river” clean-up, which includes cleaning the area of the Blackwater River from just south of the I-10 bridge to as far north as our boats can safely venture. We usually remove about a ton (2,000 lbs.) of trash from the water and river banks during our 4 hour adventure.

Over the last couple of years the Event Leader has been Big Al. Her tireless effort helped make this a very successful event as about a dozen Pyrate ships sailed in from the horizon to participate.

Once again, the food was great and the results were amazing. A cleaner waterway.

Our Missions

In May we work with our Coast Guard and Florida Fish and Wildlife partners to help educate the local boaters. We set up stations to provide a free boaters safety inspection for every vessel entering the waterways around Carpenter Park and Russell Harbor boat launches. This inspection coincides with the National Boater Safety Week. If any boat fails the inspection due to lack of safety equipment, the Blackwater Pyrates provide the necessary equipment for free. It is our way of giving back to the community we support.

In addition we carry on the maritime tradition of Blessing the Fleet. This tradition dates back hundreds of years. As the fleet of fishermen exited their harbors, the local priests provided a blessing for safe passage and a bountiful catch.

Also in September, the Blackwater Pyrates conduct the “Upper River” Clean-Up. Although this is one of our core missions, generally it turns out to be a leisurely float on the Blackwater River.

A hearty group of Pyrates gather their canoes and kayaks (and coolers) at the northern edge of the Blackwater River State Park in the early hours of the morning (usually around 10 ish). As they set sail heading in a southerly direction, they collect the trash from our beautiful waterways.

Captain Murky has been the Event Leader for the last several years, and this year he decided it was time to make it a weekend event.

Early in the year, Captain Murky reserved a campsite at the Blackwater River State Park and invited all interested Pyrates to join him. The weekend event was designed to provide a central location for the Pyrates to gather before and after the river clean-up.


